When the great ones fail to meet their goals they figure out new ways to try again. But always they have had varied and continually changing objectives.

The idea, "Go for it" is a good one. Just be sure you have other "its" to replace the one you're going for.

PACIFIC MASTERS SWIMMING METRIC SHORT COURSE INVITATIONAL

Sponsored by Sonoma State University and the City of Rohnert Park May 29, 30, and 31, 1987

Held under the sanction of USMS & Pacific Masters Swim Committee # 87009

LOCATION:

Sonoma State University is located on Petaluma Hill Road and East Cotati Ave. in Rohnert Park, California. Accessibility from Highway 101 is onto the Rohnert Park Expressway-east to Petaluma Hill Road, right and right again onto the campus. The pool is directly ahead and parking is to the right, or north of the pool facility.

POOL:

Exceptionally fast 25 yard by 25 meter heated outdoor pool with 8' wide lanes, anti-wave lane lines and Colorado Electronic Timing System.

TIME:

On Friday, May 29 the meet will start at 3:00 p.m. with warm up available at 1:00 p.m. On Saturday and Sunday, the meet will begin at 9:00 a.m. with warm-up available at 8:00 a.m.

RULES:

The meet will be governed by the 1986 USMS and PMS Rules. A current PMS registration card is required for participation and must be shown upon demand.

United States Masters Swimming (1987) registration is available at the meet (\$13.00).

CHECK-IN:

This meet will be deck seeded. All swimmers in events 1,2,3 and 4, the 800 meters and 1500 meters, must check in at least 30 minutes prior to the anticipated start of the heat. Swimmers in events on Saturday and Sunday, May 30 and 31st must check in by 8:30 a.m. for Events 5,6,7 and 8 and 21,22,23 and 24 respectively. All others should check in by 9:00 a.m.

AGE GROUPS:

Age groups will be swum in the usual five year increments and will include a 19-24 year age group. A competitors age is determined by his/her age on the last day of the meet.

SNACK BAR:

A snack bar will be available on Saturday and Sunday from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

PROGRAM:

A program will be available at a nominal cost and will include a list of local restaurants.

AWARDS:

Rosettes and Ribbons will be awarded for the first six places. Team and individual points will not be kept.

ENTRIES:

Swimmers are limited to five events per day. Men and women will forward a blue or a pink IBM card respectively for each event to be entered and one consolidated card completely filled out with associated fees. The entry fee for each event is \$1.75 and a \$2.00 per person surcharge will be levied to cover costs of computerization of the meet. All entries must be postmarked by May 15. Late entries and deck entries will be charged \$2.50 per event plus the surcharge; \$5.00 per relay. Make check payable to the City of Rohnert Park.



Do you ever feel lonely swimming your laps, or starting off on a race--you in your lane against all these strangers? Try the fun of the llth Annual Hawaiian Postal Relays!

Swimming is such an individual sport that we sometimes miss the fun of Team effort—the esprit de corps. Relays give us a chance to work together to accomplish jointly what a single swimmer cannot do. These fun relays give everyone a choice of short sprints, long swims, or favorite strokes. It's fun to be needed in a relay.

The Postal Relays have events for men and women in every Masters age group in seven different and unusual relays. The idea for a Masters Postal Relay Meet came from old college swimmers Richard Merritt and Gary Niemeyer. Inventing Relays that were not swum in the Nationals was a fun idea, and noncompetive with the National meet. It's a good event since all those not in shape from the winter months can still compete on a national level with out leaving ones home town.

All in all it is a wonderful chance to enhance any clubs swim program and to even get national recognition. It is an opportunity to be a national record holder. The event is getting into the mature stage (aren't we all) and if you haven't participated now is the time to enjoy an April's day of swimming with your friends but also against the nation's best teams. Some teams have made a Hawaii day out of their relay day, with Hawaiian food, pictures, posters, leis and flowers, and even an award to any member relay team that sets a national record! The possibilities are endless. It's more fun than a picnic—infact, combined with a picnic it's a whole day of FUN.

- A. Open to all clubs registered with the U.S. Masters Swimming (or equivalent in other countries). Multiclub or Association entries are excluded from this event as of 1981, although records set prior to this date are still valid. Clubs may enter any number of relay teams in each event as long as rule B/C is not violated. If a club enters more than one relay in one event, please denote each relay with a postscript A, B, C, etc.
- B. Each team consists of four individuals
- C. EACH INDIVIDUAL can swim in all seven relays in any age group equal to or younger than their own. HOWEVER, a swimmer may enter each relay only once. FOR EXAMPLE, a 40 year old may choose to swim in the 25+ back relay therefore the swimmer can not enter the 35+ back relay. Relays which have both men and women should be entered as a men's relay.
- D. Events are to be held in a 25 yard pool, events in meters will be converted to "yard time".
- E. USMS rules apply for the timing of each event. (Please note: this event has not been recognized by USMS)

Eligibility: National Championships are open to any USMS registered swimmer who is at least 25 years old as of May 18, 1987. If you wish to represent a club, you and the club must be registered in the same LMSC; if there are any questions about your affiliation, you will swim "unattached." Foreign swimmers must submit their International Travel Permit with the entry form and fees.

Entry blank: There are no qualifying standards for this meet. Write your best time or a reasonable estimate in the space next to the event(s) you wish to enter. Do not enter with "no time." You can enter a total of six events, no more than three on any of the first three days (not including relays). On the final day you may enter only one event, either the 1000 free or the 1650 free.

Meet conduct: The meet brochure contains the details of the administration of the meet. All events will be preseded, with the exception of the 1650 free, 1000 free, 500 free, 400 l.M., and the relays, which will be deck seeded.

Age groups: 25-29, 30-34, and so on up to 85-89 and 90 + . Your age on the last day of the meet (May 18, 1987) determines your age group for the entire meet. All events swim oldest to youngest, slowest to fastest.

Awards: National Masters medals to first through tenth places.

Scoring: Individual events: (men/women): 11, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1. See relay entry form for relay scoring.

Fees: \$3.00 per individual event, plus \$13.00 surcharge per swimmer. Fees must accompany the entry form; an entry is not complete until the check clears the bank. If there are problems with fees, full cash payment will be required before you can swim. Refund requests must be in writing and received by the meet director no later than April 15, 1987. Fees must be paid in U.S. dollars by check or money order. Checks payable to Los Altos Masters National Meet.

Banquet: An Italian pasta buffet will be held at Ricky's Hyatt Hotel Ballroom on Sunday, May 17, 1987. No host cocktails at 6:00 PM; dinner at 7:00 PM. Dancing from 7:00 PM until 11:00 PM. The cost is \$19 per person. Reservations must be included on the form below.


