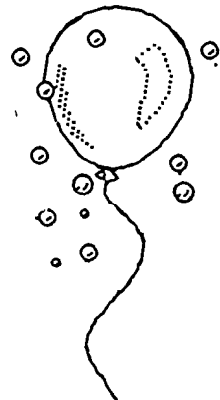
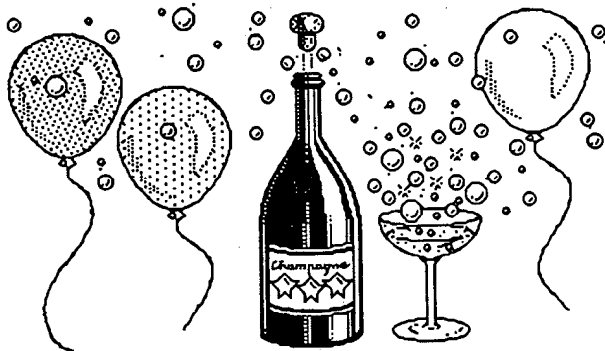

1987 CONVENTION REPORT

Oregon Masters Swimming was recently represented at the United States Aquatic Sports Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, by Bert Petersen, Barabara Frid, and Sandi Rousseau. Between the three of us, we attended almost all committee meetings that were held during the five days in order to have as much input at the National level as possible. The reams of papers and committee reports would overwhelm all of us, so we will try to summarize the highlights of decisions and rules changes. Anyone who would like to see more detailed information may contact one of us.

1989 National Championships will be held in the following locations:

Short Course: Mission Bay Aquatic Center
Boca Raton, Florida

Long Course: Grand Forks, North Dakota

Sports Information Brochures: The Sports Medicine Committee has developed three brochures which will soon be available through our National office. They are entitled: (1) "The Role of the Medical Exam in Masters Swimming", (2) Fitness and Health through Masters Swimming, and (3) Exercise and Pregnancy. As these become available, we will obtain copies which you may look at during our meets. All will be available at a nominal cost.

Warm-up and Warm-down Procedures: Suggested guidelines for warm-ups and warm-downs will soon be available for all local meets. USMS encourages local groups to utilize these guidelines to ensure safety at our meets. We will publish these in the Aquamaster in the near future.

1988 Masters Calendars: Twenty-four smashing swim suited bodies are featured in the new calendars. These are now available for purchase at meets or through Barbara Frid at the Swim Cellar.

U.S. Masters Coach of the Year is Kerry O'Brien from Walnut Creek Masters, California.

Rules Changes: Note that the following list does not include all changes made to our USMS rules; however, these are the ones that affect your everyday life at swim meets.

1. Awards at National meets will be given to the top three teams in each "small" (16 women, 16 men , & 32 combined) and "large" (over 16, 16, & 32) team divisions.

2. If the 1650 or 1500 is swum on the first day of a National meet, the resulting second day program shall be interchanged with the resulting third day program, i.e. the 500 free will not be on the day following the 1650/1500.

3. All meets must now have a minimum of 1 referee, 1 starter, 2 stroke and turn judges, and 2 timers (referring to non electronically timed meets). The starter and referee may double as stroke and turn judges. NOTE: This is not a change to our current Oregon contract for meets, but it has never been defined specifically in the USMS Rules.

4. Obstructing another swimmer by swimming across or otherwise interfering may disqualify the offender and the offender shall immediately be removed from the lane.

This sums up the convention. We all enjoyed the meetings but saw little, in fact nothing, of Atlanta, except Flamingo Joes. You can ask us about that later!

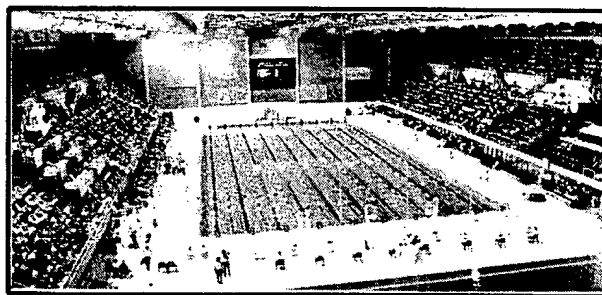



You shall be registered for OMS unless you otherwise specify.

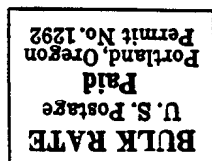
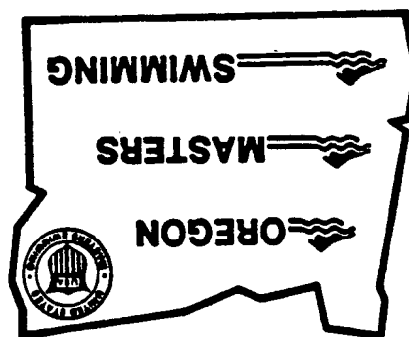
